

## THE BORING BUT IMPORTANT BIT FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Your son/daughter will need your written permission to participate in club activities that take place away from the Church Hall premises.

Each term's programme of events is approved by the Wroughton Parish Church P.C.C.

We ask for your permission for your son/daughter to accompany us on offsite events as part of the membership enrolment form. We will ask for a completed enrolment form when a member first joins the club and then at least once a year from then on if they wish to remain a member (normally at the start of the academic year).

If you are unwilling to give your consent for your son/daughter to attend a particular offsite event, please don't send them to club on that night as we will not offer an alternative activity.

If you know your son/daughter will not be attending an offsite event please let us know in advance so that we are not left waiting in vain.

In addition to the dates of the club events, published in this programme, the leadership of the 115 Club would like to draw your attention to the Church at 4 service, a weekly service for children and young families with music, crafts, games and discussions. This service takes place every Sunday from 4pm to 5pm in the church hall, Priors Hill (opposite the Brown Jack public house).

Attendance at these services is not obligatory, but they are light hearted and fun. If you feel you would like to attend we would be pleased to see you at any/all of these services.
